Two DARCOM PM's cited by the Secretary of the Army

BRIG. Gen. Edward M. Browne has been presented the coveted Secretary of the Army Award for "Program Manager of the Year," and COL (P) Richard D. Kenyon has been presented the award for "Project Manager of the Year."

The presentations were made by the Assistant Secretary of the Army Percy A. Pierre during the Army Project Managers recent conference in Florida.

This was the first time since the award began three years ago that two individuals were selected for this honor. In the past only one manager award had been presented.

BG Browne was selected for his outstanding performance as Program Manager for the Advanced Attack Helicopter.

His citation reads as follows:

Brigadier General Edward M. Browne is cited for outstanding performance as Program Manager for the Advanced Attack Helicopter during the critical period July 1977 through June 1978. Through his initiative, technical competence, excellent judgment, and astute managerial ability, General Browne managed and coordinated the activities of a complex multi-level program interfacing AAH, Target Acquisition Designa-



tion System/Pilot Night Vision System, and 30mm Ammunition while restructuring his overall program to meet directed fiscal reduction and maintaining established schedule, performance, and cost goals during a period of strict personnel and fiscal austerity, an achievement of great distinction. General Browne's performance reflects great credit upon himself, the Advanced Attack Helicopter Program, and the United States Army.

The second award went to **COL Kenyon**, Project Manager — Black Hawk. His citation reads:

Plans Developed to Aid Army Aviation Museum

THE need for a new home for the items which record Army Aviation's history was stressed recently by **Ray Fitzgerald** of Enterprise, secretary of the Army Aviation Museum Foundation, Inc.

He outlined the foundation's efforts to obtain money to build a modern structure for the \$45 million of aviation artifacts that are now housed in two WWII buildings at Ft. Rucker, Ala. One of the efforts was a referendum in January 1976 to approve the sale of \$2 in state bonds for such construction.

"It was a state-wide referendum, and it was defeated by apathy," Fitzgerald said. "In our local three counties of Dale, Houston, and Coffee, less than 10% of the registered voters came out to help us get a museum at Fort Rucker."

\$1.35 billion tourist industry

There's a practical value to be derived from the museum, the secretary noted, and that is money.

"The tourist industry in Alabama is now worth **\$1.35 billion** a year, and it is still growing. It's estimated that each person leaves \$99 for lodging, gas, food, and other expenditures in the area when he visits a tourist attraction.

"Our museum had 79,000 visitors last year, but even so we dropped from fifth to eighth position on the state's list of attractions. So, if we are going to share in the tourist industry's growth, we have to put the **Army Aviation Museum** in a setting that will have more appeal to visitors."

Thoughts for the New Year

ON Sunday, 17 December 1978, I had the occasion to visit Kitty Hawk, N.C., along with representatives of the Navy and Air Staffs and other federal and state officials to participate in ceremonies commemorating the 75th Anniversary of the **Wright Brothers'** first powered flight.

Although I had visited the Wright Memorial in years past, this time it was quite a sight to see with a myriad of modern day aircraft and helicopters converging on the small runway alongside Kill Devil Hills.

Thousands of people lined the grassy field from which the first flight was made, obviously in stark contrast to the small group of pioneers there on that cold, windy day in 1903. But, in 1978, a rather nostalgic and historic program included remarks by many notable personalities, including **Attorney General Griffin Bell** who brought greetings from **President Carter**. In addition, a number of direct descendents of those who made the

first flight possible and one who actually participated in crating the aircraft were present and introduced.

But the highlight of the morning was the launching of an exact replica of the Wright "**Flyer**" in the same manner and at precisely the same moment as the original craft had flown three quarters of a century before. This historic re-enactment was then followed by a flyby of F-105 aircraft from the North Carolina ANG.

What a contrast in the reality of flight in such a short span of 75 years! **Orville Wright** flew for twelve seconds and traveled 120 feet — a distance less than the length of a coach section of a modern day commercial transport.

In fact, perhaps the overall specifications of the original aircraft can place it in better perspective as compared to today's aerial giants. You'll find a comparison of the various specifications of the Wright **Flyer** compared to the Boeing 747 on the next page.

So, the next time you're looking over the -10 of your aircraft, you will appreciate the aerospace advances in this relatively brief period of the air age. In fact, bringing it closer to home, **Army Aviation** will soon pass its 37th year, one half of the entire history of powered flight. And, **Army Aviation**,

too, has seen equally remarkable growth, not simply in size, performance, and quantity, but more importantly, in doctrinal application.

From a simple beginning with but 'grasshopper' spotter aircraft off the coast of Africa in 1942, aviation's contribution now extends to every element of combat power — maneuver, firepower, communications, command and control, and logistics. Furthermore, as technology reduces the size of the battlefield, weapons become more sophisticated, and the threat even greater, **Army Aviation** will continue to have an even bigger role to play.

Key milestones ahead

With 1979 now upon us, it poses a wide range of new challenges and will bring even more key milestones in the continuing history of **Army Aviation**.

Some of the bigger and more significant are:

- Determination as to the preferred career pattern and alternate specialty

elections under OPMS for the Army Aviator - Specialty Code 15.

- Conduct of the DA study to evaluate the personnel management program for aviation maintenance MOS Series 67 and 68 (1 February -10 July 1979).

- **REFORGER 79** in a winter scenario during the period of 30 January - 7 February.

- Conduct of **TASVAL** at the Combat Developments Experimentation Center, Ft. Hunter Liggett, Calif., April through September with troops, aircraft, and equipment of the 7th Infantry Division, 6th Cavalry, and the 4th Mechanized Division.

TASVAL is a real time field evaluation of fixed and rotary wing aircraft accomplishing anti-armor missions in a mid-intensity environment. Army, Air Force, and Marine Corps aircraft will participate with AH-1S, AH-1T, A-4, A-10, and F-4 aircraft. This test should provide significant data concerning relative survivability and effectiveness of the aircraft tested under varying tactical conditions.

- **AAAA's** Twenty-First Annual National Convention in Atlanta, Georgia, 19-22 April: the first time ever for a national convention to be held out of the Washington Metropolitan area. **General Robert M. Shoemaker**, the Commander of FORSCOM, and his

team of experts, including **BG W.C. Honeycutt**, **Colonel Bill Hobbs**, and the **FORSCOM** aviation staff are coordinating a super program of professional presentations.

Aviation Hardware

- Initial delivery of the **UH-60A Black Hawk** to an operational unit will be to the 101st Airborne Division, Ft. Campbell, Kentucky.
- Release of the first **OH-58C** to troop units is expected early this year.
- The initial **CH-47D** prototype will be rolled out of the factory on 6 March and fly in May, well ahead of its September first flight schedule.
- **AH-1S Cobras** with 20mm cannons and the new universal turret are being delivered to **FORSCOM** units this year.
- Continuing **PIP's** to existing aircraft will concentrate heavily on survivability

equipment and improved communication packages.

Meanwhile, at the training base, aviator production will increase. Specifically, commissioned officer inputs to Fort Rucker are programmed to increase not simply in FY 79, but continuing into 1980 and 1981. This should assist greatly in relieving the existing shortfall in company grade aviators and sustaining the force to meet **ARCSA III** aviation structure requirements.

The **ARCSA** study will also receive its annual update, and ground work is

being laid for **ARCSA IV** to commence in FY 80.

In keeping with the OSD decision that Navy undergraduate helicopter pilot training should be consolidated with Army training at Fort Rucker commencing in FY 80, the Army and Navy are jointly preparing plans for a smooth transition of Navy training, to include Marine Corps and Coast Guard students, into Fort Rucker. These plans are expected to be presented to the Department of the Army and the Department of the Navy in April. Final plans and execution thereof, of course, will be subject to Congressional approval of the FY 80 budget later this year.

So, 1979 will be a full year, and I am proud to be a part of **Army Aviation** on the move. And while on the move, I had the pleasure of visiting Fort Eustis on 10 January and speaking to the local AAAA Chapter at the invitation of **Colonel Dick Stoessner**.

I took full advantage of the opportunity and visited the maintenance and armament training facilities and participated in a brief "over the beach" operation in the **LACV-30 (Air Cushion Vehicle)**. It was indeed impressive to see not just the quality of

the physical plant, but more importantly, the quality of instruction, instructors and students.

A visit to the "Standing Tall" School Brigade commanded by **Colonel Beitz**,

coupled with breakfast in a unit mess, clearly demonstrated to me the highest standards of excellence of the unit staff.

I've always had a wealth of respect for our maintenance team and assure you that based on what I saw at Fort Eustis this month, our future is in good hands. **MG DeHaven** and his entire team at the Transportation School deserve



QUESTION: What is the only known Air Force Base that has more Army aircraft assigned to it than it has Air Force aircraft?

ANSWER: Whiteman AFB, Missouri.

Whiteman, named for the first Army Air Corps aviator killed at Pearl Harbor, is a quiet little base located in the rolling hill country of mid-Missouri.

"Quiet" is the proper description because after years reverberating with the jet blasts of B-47 engines — which it no longer has — the base is "quiet" by Air Force standards.

The last Air Force fixed-wing aircraft based at **Whiteman**, a T-29, left in the early '70's. Now, instead of taking off "into the wild blue yonder," as the song goes, they've gone underground!

Whiteman is now the headquarters for 150 **Minuteman** ICBM's that lie nestled in their silos to help keep North America

free for democracy. Admittedly, there's really not much excitement in being on a missile crew, and I guess that's the way it's supposed to be.

Once upon a time the airmen at **Whiteman** could get their jollies flying as a member of the base Aero Club but for reasons that are not entirely clear the Club was closed down in January 1977.

Seven times the aircraft!

"I don't know why they call us the Air Force," one missile officer said recently, lamenting the boredom of his job. "The Army has the real air force at this base!"

He was speaking of the Army National Guard's **Aviation Support Facility** with its **29** — count 'em, **29!** — Bell **UH-1** helicopters. The unit was moved to the base from its former location near

Warrensburg, Mo., in August 1974, because of the availability of the large ramp, control tower, fire station, and other facilities associated with an air base that were not fully utilized by the Air Force.

The unit, commanded by **LTC B.A. Pierceall**, MO-ARNG, has 235 total personnel, 40 of whom are fulltime technicians. One of the major steps taken to make their new home really first class was to build a new hangar and office building.

The **Facility** hasn't had an accident since **Colonel Pierceall** became commander in July 1961 . . . but this is something about which he doesn't boast for it could change in the twinkling of an eye. Nevertheless, this is an impressive record. In 1976, Hq 5th Army, Ft. Sam Houston, Texas, awarded the unit a **Certificate of Achievement** for having 5,000 accident-free flying hours.

One of the best!

The **635th Aviation Company (Assault Helicopter)**, which the **Facility** supports, was rated as one of the top five in the entire Army Aviation structure. In an evaluation report, **Colonel Hilton D. Payne**, CS, Executive Officer, V Readiness Region, 5th Army, wrote: "The esprit consistently displayed by all members of the unit, coupled with the truly professional manner in which each and every task is carried out, is something that would have to be viewed in order to believe it."





AAAA Scholarship

WITH SOME 10 scholarship awards being awarded to the sons and daughters of members or deceased members of AAAA on 3 March, I feel that all Association members might like to know a bit more about the Scholarship Foundation itself, and perhaps several of the details of the unique selection process pursued by the AAAA.

It appears — at this mid-January point in time — that an applicant's 1979 chances of winning an AAAA cash scholarship award are one in four (40 applicants for approximately ten scholarships).

A word or two about the Foundation — The AAAA Scholarship Foundation, Inc., is a separate corporate entity administered by a 10-member Board of Governors.

DIRECTION

The AAAA Scholarship Foundation, Inc., a separate non-profit corporate entity, is administered by a ten-member Board of Governors that includes Bryce Wilson, a former National President of AAAA, as its President; LTG G.P. Seneff, Jr., Ret., Vice President; COL Delbert L. Bristol, Ret., Secretary; Arthur H. Kesten, Treasurer; and the following retired officers as Governors: MGs George S. Beatty & John L. Klingenhagen; BG Robert M. Leigh; COLs Nelson A. Mahone, Jr. & John W. Marr; and LTC Donald F. Luce. ■

The primary tasks of the Board of Governors are to establish the requirements for a workable scholarship assistance program, determine the number and dollar amount of total scholarship aid to be given in any particular year (and this is dependent upon donations received), and coordinate with the AAAA on the establishment and implementation of fund-raising programs.

In respect to fund-raising, the Foundation is a tax-exempt organization under the IRS Code, and donations, bequests, etc. are deductible from income and estate taxes.

The Foundation Board of Governors does not select the annual AAAA Scholarship winners. This task is performed by the AAAA National Award Committee, the same committee that selects the AAAA's National Awards Winners ("Aviator of the Year," etc.) each year. **Brigadier General Robert M. Leigh, Ret.**, chairs this 14-member committee.

An impartial selection

While the Governors recognize that several members of the AAAA National Awards Committee might know some of the parents of the scholarship applicants, they feel that adequate steps have been taken to assure an impartial selection — one that would meet with your personal approval.

This is accomplished in the following manner:

- All applications for scholarship information, forms, etc., and all com-

s at Work!

pleted forms (personal, academic, interview, etc.) are submitted to one source, the AAAA National Office, and

- The National Office censors all documents prior to review by the members of the Awards Committee, the censoring consisting of the removal of the names of all applicants, parents, and AAAA interviewers, and the substitution of a **file number** to identify all documents associated with a particular application.

- The members of the Awards Committee review the records of the applicant, then, **without** knowing the applicant's identity. The actual process is a bit more complicated, but the fact remains that the committee members — in being unaware of the identity of the applicants — may judge and compare their academic and personal qualifications, and do so without prejudice or conflict of interest.

Full list not disclosed

- Having worked with **file numbers** only, the Awards Committee does not know the names of the winners it selects, first learning these names **after** the selection of the last winner has been made.

- At this point, the Chairman requests a National Office representative to open the sealed envelope, and to read the names of those applicants having the winning **file numbers**. The Committee is not shown the entire list of applicants at any time in the process, Foundation policy calling for the names

of the non-winners to remain confidential.

I hope the foregoing has provided you with some insight into the process the Foundation pursues to assure an impartial selection of winners each year. Actually, the real problem is not one of guarding the identity of the competitors. An exceptionally large number of bright young men and women compete for these AAAA cash awards each year, and the real problem is **selecting** the winners.

Suggestions are solicited

Your comments on all facets of this AAAA program — initial forms, selection, notification, etc. — are welcome. Many of the program's refinements were initiated through suggestions made by members, applicants, and parents.

It is a source of some satisfaction to the Governors and to the AAAA National Awards Committee that several divisional units and Army posts — in initiating their own scholarship award programs — have heard about the Association's selection process and have written to the AAAA for details.

Having given you this background just prior to the time of the '79 award selections, the Board of Governors believes that you're in a better position to appreciate the worthiness of this fine AAAA program.

has four UH-1F helicopters for support of missile operations at **Whiteman** so the base is not completely devoid of Air Force aircraft.

"I was asked once by an officer of the Air Force Inspector General's Office if we could handle the mission of the 37th ARRS," **Colonel Pierceall** recalled. "I told him that we could, but the idea was shot down up the line somewhere. The reason given was that the Air Force didn't want to lose their helicopter capability."

Army flying "More fun!"

Bob Watson of Warrensburg, Mo., used to be an Air Force pilot flying C-123's out of **Whiteman**. After release from active duty he took a reduction from captain to chief warrant officer (CW2) just to be able to fly UH-1's with the Army National Guard.

"They're more fun than flying C-123's," says the 48-year-old aviator. "Flying nap-of-the-earth is a little hard to do in a C-123."

ning, he said, to enlist the support of military and civic groups (to include the AAAA), businesses, and individuals to see if the goal can be reached through the cooperative efforts of everyone.

If we fail to preserve these artifacts, we will have done an injustice to ourselves who were a part of making that history, as well as to those who follow us by denying them an opportunity to observe the technological progress of Army Aviation," he added.
